


IT'S THEIR FUTURE

Since 2002, IslandWood has been offering transformative learning experiences in the natural environment for children, graduate students, and teachers in the Puget Sound region. More than 60,000 elementary school students and 300 graduate students have spent well over 1 million waking hours exploring our 255-acre wooded campus, building deeper connections to the world around them, and developing an expanded sense of possibility for themselves, their communities, and the planet. The result: legions of diverse young leaders with the knowledge, compassion, and inspiration to create a brighter future for all of us.

CHANGING WITH THE WORLD

Over the last five years, IslandWood has set a bold course to expand our impact: to empower a new generation of scientists, stewards, and educators who have the confidence to make a positive impact on the environment, starting in their home communities; to bring environmental education to the places where our participants live and learn; and to leverage the talents of others by bringing together local and national leaders on issues related to education, health, and the environment.

A SPRINGBOARD TO NATIONAL IMPACT

IslandWood's work in the greater Seattle area is a launching point for deep national impact. TRAINING 21ST CENTURY EDUCATORS



IslandWood prepares educators to address 21st century challenges by using the environment as a context for teaching and learning. Our classrooms are the urban and natural ecosystems that make up the fabric of the places where we live, learn, work, and play.

MASTERS PROGRAM IN EDUCATION FOR ENVIRONMENT AND COMMUNITY

Graduate students in this residency program learn the best practices of environmental, experiential, and multicultural education while completing the first half of a Masters in Education through the nationally-ranked University of Washington College of Education.

MASTERS IN URBAN ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

IslandWood's Urban Graduate Program, offered in partnership with Antioch University Seattle, prepares a diverse cadre of educators to empower the next generation of leaders with the skills to create resilient and sustainable solutions to immediate and future environmental challenges.

NATURE PASSPORT

IslandWood and Nature Play Western Australia have teamed up to create a tool that promises to get children all over the world moving, exploring, and learning in nature. The Nature Passport App blends education with the essential ingredient of any outdoor outing – fun.

URBAN SCHOOL PROGRAMS

IslandWood's Urban School Programs are a national model for environmental education centered on the communities where children live and learn. Programs take place in schools, parks, and other natural spaces, and focus on critical issues - like stormwater runoff - that affect the health of our cities.

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT THROUGH PARTNERSHIP

FRESH TRACKS LEADERSHIP EXPEDITIONS

Inspired by the Obama Administration's commitment to connecting more young Americans to the outdoors, Fresh Tracks will impact youth from urban and rural communities nationwide, beginning with an August 2016 pilot program focused on Los Angeles and Alaska. Fresh Tracks participants will travel together to both regions and explore diverse cultures and the outdoors, enabling each group to learn from the other, build critical leadership skills, and discover they have a voice as advocates for their communities.

NO CHILD LEFT INSIDE

Over the last year, IslandWood led an alliance of organizations that successfully advocated for \$1 million in funding to get thousands of kids across Washington State outdoors. The high demand for grant funding points to a need to continue this advocacy effort on behalf of all kids in Washington State - and beyond.

COLLECTIVE IMPACT

ACTION SUMMITS
